- **acceleration lane** lane that permits drivers entering an expressway to accelerate to the speed of expressway traffic (225)
- **accelerator pedal** controls the flow of fuel to the engine and regulates speed (43)
- **active restraint device** restraint device that you have to engage (100)
- **advisory speed limit** speed limit set for special conditions such as sharp curves (22)
- **alternator** device that generates an electrical current needed to recharge the battery and operate electrical equipment in a vehicle (357)
- alternator warning light light or gauge on the instrument panel warning that the battery is being drained (41)
- **angle parking** parking the vehicle diagonally to the curb (120)
- **antilock braking system (ABS)** computercontrolled braking system that keeps the wheels from locking if the driver brakes hard (41)
- **assigned-risk insurance** provides minimum bodily injury and property damage liability coverage to high-risk drivers for a higher premium (346)
- **backup lights** white lights at the rear of the vehicle that tell other drivers you are backing up (81)
- **banked curve** curve higher on the outside than it is on the inside that helps overcome a vehicle's tendency to move to the outside of the curve (97)
- basic speed law law stating that you may not drive faster than is safe and prudent for existing conditions, regardless of posted speed limits (22)
- **belted tire** tire that has special layers added to a bias-ply tire for improved strength, performance, and mileage (365)
- **blind-spot area** area that rearview mirrors cannot show (44)
- **blood-alcohol concentration (BAC)** amount of alcohol in the blood expressed as a percentage of alcohol in the bloodstream (318)
- **blowout** sudden loss of tire air pressure while driving (95, 268)
- **blue-book price** average market value for a specific model and age of a used vehicle (339)
- **bodily-injury insurance** covers the driver who is at fault against claims (342)
- **brake fade** loss of braking effectiveness caused by the brakes overheating after long, continuous, hard braking (270)

- **braking distance** distance your vehicle travels from the time you apply the brake until your vehicle stops (99)
- **car pooling** several individuals sharing transportation to one or more destinations in a car (349)
- **carbon monoxide** colorless, odorless, tasteless gas contained in the exhaust fumes of gasoline engines (261)
- **carburetor** engine part that mixes air and gasoline in the proper proportion and sends it as a fine mist to the engine cylinders (361)
- **catalytic converter** part of a vehicle's emission system that converts harmful gases into less harmful gases and water (361)
- **center of gravity** point around which an object's weight is evenly distributed (92)
- **central vision** cone-shaped area of up to 10 degrees in your field of vision in which you can see clearly while looking straight ahead (68)
- **closed zone** space not open to you because of a restriction in your line of sight or intended path of travel (66)
- **clutch pedal** pedal in a manual transmission vehicle that enables a driver to shift gears (43)
- collision contact between two or more objects, as when two vehicles collide into each other (9)
- **collision insurance** provides coverage to pay the costs of repair or replacement of your vehicle from a collision (344)
- **color-blindness** inability to distinguish colors (298)
- **commentary driving** system of thinking out loud as you practice the IPDE Process (83)
- **common speed** speed used by most drivers on an expressway (231)
- **comprehensive insurance** provides coverage for replacement or repair of your vehicle from damage other than from a collision (344)
- **compromise space** reduce risk by giving as much space as possible to the greater of two or more hazards (79)
- **console** compartment mounted between the front seats in a vehicle (42)
- **controlled-access highway** highway that vehicles can enter and exit only at interchanges (222)
- **controlled braking** reducing speed as quickly as possible while maintaining steering control of your vehicle (258)

- **controlled intersection** intersection at which traffic signals or signs determine the right of way (134)
- **controlled railroad crossing** railroad crossing controlled by flashing red lights and/or crossing gates (138)
- **countersteer** steer in the opposite direction (277)
- **cover the brake** take your foot off the accelerator and hold it over the brake pedal to be ready to brake quickly (184)
- **crossbuck** large white X-shaped sign located beside an uncontrolled railroad crossing (141)
- **cruise control** device that lets you maintain your desired speed without keeping your foot on the accelerator (42)
- **deceleration lane** expressway lane used to slow your vehicle without blocking vehicles behind you (235)
- **decide** third step of the IPDE Process in which the driver selects the best actions as well as when and where to take them to avoid conflicts (6)
- **deductible** amount an insurance policyholder agrees to pay toward vehicle repair or replacement (344)
- **defensive driving** protecting yourself and others from dangerous and unexpected driving situations (7)
- **delayed green light** indicates that one side of an intersection has a green light while the light for the oncoming traffic remains red (137)
- **depreciation** decrease in the value of a vehicle over time (336)
- **depressant** drug that can slow down the central nervous system (321)
- **depth perception** ability to judge distance between yourself and other objects (300)
- **designated driver** person who decides ahead of time not to drink alcoholic beverages and is appointed to drive others who do drink (320)
- **differential** arrangement of gears at the rear of the vehicle allowing one wheel to revolve faster than the opposite wheel during turns (356)
- **downshifting** shifting from a higher to a lower gear (56)
- drive shaft in rear-wheel vehicles, long metal tube turned by the transmission that carries power to the differential (356)

- **driving task** all social, physical, and mental skills required to drive (6)
- driving under the influence (DUI) an offense for which a driver can be charged in some states if the driver's blood-alcohol concentration is above 0.05 (323)
- driving while intoxicated (DWI) an offense for which a driver can be charged in all states if the driver's blood-alcohol concentration is above a certain level (323)
- **emotion** strong feeling such as anger, fear, and joy (292)
- **energy of motion** kinetic energy or the energy an object has because it is moving (93)
- **engine-management system** computerized system that monitors and adjusts the fuel, ignition, and emission systems (371)
- **entrance ramp** ramp leading onto an expressway (225)
- **euphoria** false sense of well-being developed as a result of alcohol or drug consumption (315)
- **execute** fourth step of the IPDE Process in which a driver performs proper vehicle control responses to avoid possible conflicts (7)
- exit ramp ramp leading off an expressway (235)
- **field of vision** all the area a person can see while looking straight ahead (67)
- **field sobriety test** series of on-the-spot, roadside tests that help an officer detect impairment of a driver suspected of DUI or DWI (324)
- **financial responsibility law** law that requires you to prove that you can pay for collision damages you cause that result in death, injury, or property damage (342)
- **fishtail** sliding of the rear of a vehicle from side to side (258)
- **flashing signal** traffic signal that alerts drivers to dangerous conditions or tells them to stop (29)
- **force of impact** force with which one moving object hits another object; varies according to speed, weight, and distance between impact and stop (100)
- **4–6 second range** area where you will be traveling during the next 4 to 6 seconds, and where you get the final update of how you are controlling your intended path of travel (67)
- **fresh green light** light that has just turned from red to green (136)

- **friction** force that keeps each tire from sliding on the road (94)
- **friction point** in shifting, the point at which you feel the engine take hold and the vehicle start to move (53)
- **fringe vision** the part of your peripheral vision that is closest to your central vision and helps you monitor zone changes (300)
- **fuel-injection system** fuel-combustion system (replacing a carburetor) in which vaporized fuel is pumped under pressure to the engine cylinders (361)
- **full stop** a complete stop as required at a STOP sign or red light (20)
- gap distance between vehicles (144)
- **glare recovery time** time your eyes need to regain clear vision after being affected by glare (301)
- **glare resistance** ability to continue seeing when looking at bright lights (301)
- graduated driver licensing program
- program requiring young drivers to progress through a series of licensing stages with various restrictions (11)
- **gravity** force that pulls all things to earth (92) **ground viewing** making quick glances to the roadway in front of your vehicle (70)
- guide sign sign that gives directions, distance, services, points of interest, and other information (25)
- **hallucinogen** mind-altering drug that tends to distort a person's perceptions of direction, distance, and time (322)
- hand-over-hand steering pulling the steering wheel down with one hand while the other hand crosses over to pull the wheel farther down (113)
- **hazard flasher** device that flashes front turnsignal lights and taillights to warn others the vehicle is a hazard (44)
- **head restraints** padded devices on the backs of front seats that help reduce whiplash injuries in a collision (44)
- **highway hypnosis** drowsy or trancelike condition caused by concentration on the roadway ahead and monotony of driving (238)
- highway transportation system (HTS) complex system made up of people, vehicles, and roadways (4)

- **hydroplaning** occurs when a tire loses road contact by rising up on top of water (252)
- **identify** first step in the IPDE Process in which the driver locates potential hazards (6)
- **ignition switch** switch operated by a key which starts or stops the engine (42)
- implied-consent law states that anyone who receives a driver's license automatically consents to be tested for blood-alcohol content and other drugs if stopped for suspicion of drug use while driving (323)
- **inhibitions** inner forces of personality that restrain or hold back impulsive behavior (316)
- **international symbols** symbols used on traffic signs that give a message without using words (26)
- **intoxilyzer** breath-test machine most commonly used for determining blood-alcohol content (324)
- **IPDE Process** organized process of seeing, thinking, and responding that includes the steps of identifying, predicting, deciding, and executing (6–7)
- **jack** hand-operated device used to lift and hold one corner or side of the vehicle (268)
- **joining traffic** turning right or left into lanes of other vehicles (144)
- lane signal signal, usually overhead, that tells whether a lane can or cannot be used at a specific time (30)
- **leasing** alternative to purchasing a vehicle (338) **legend** chart that explains the markings and symbols used on a map (380)
- **liability insurance** provides compensation for damages to a third party for which the insured is legally obligated to pay; covers others when you are at fault (342)
- **line of sight** distance you can see ahead in the direction you are looking (65–66)
- **lug nuts** devices that hold the wheel to the vehicle (269)
- mass transportation involves moving large numbers of people together from place to place (349)
- master cylinder device in the brake system from which brake fluid is forced to the wheel cylinders when a driver steps on the brake pedal (363)

- **median** area of ground separating traffic moving in opposite directions (202)
- **merging area** stretch of roadway at the end of an acceleration lane on an expressway where vehicles join the flow of traffic (225)
- minimize a hazard reduce the possibility of conflict by putting more space between your vehicle and the hazard (78)
- minimum speed limit speed limit to keep traffic moving safely by not allowing drivers to drive slower than a certain speed (22)
- **moped** two-wheeled vehicle that can be driven with either a motor or pedal (160)
- **motor scooter** low-powered, two-wheeled vehicle that is more powerful than a moped (161)
- **muffler** device that reduces the noise from combustion sounds in the engine (362)
- **navigating** following a route by reading a map (384)
- **night blindness** not being able to see well at night (300)
- **no-fault insurance** covers an insured's losses and expenses associated with a collision regardless of who is at fault (342)
- **no-zones** large blind-spot areas where truck drivers cannot see other vehicles (168)
- **nystagmus** involuntary jerking of the eyes as a person gazes to the side (325)
- **odometer** device on the instrument panel indicating the total number of miles the vehicle has been driven (40)
- **oil pump** device that forces oil from the oil pan to parts of the engine that need lubrication (359)
- **open zone** space where you can drive without a restriction to your line of sight or intended path of travel (65)
- **orderly visual search pattern** process of searching critical areas in a regular sequence (67)
- **overdriving headlights** driving at a speed that makes your stopping distance longer than the distance lighted by your headlights (248)
- **oversteer** turning the steering wheel too much (110)
- overtake pass the vehicle ahead (186)
 over-the-counter (OTC) medicine drug that can be obtained legally without a doctor's prescription (321)

- **parallel parking** parking the vehicle parallel to the curb (121)
- **passive restraint device** restraint device, such as an air bag or an automatic seat belt, that works automatically (100)
- **path of travel** space your vehicle will occupy as you travel ahead (65)
- **pedestrian signal** signal used at heavy traffic intersections that tells pedestrians whether they should walk or wait (30)
- **peer education** process in which young people help other young people make decisions and determine goals (327)
- **peer pressure** influence of others of a similar age (326)
- **perception distance** distance your vehicle travels during perception time (98)
- **perception time** length of time you take to identify, predict, and decide to slow for a hazard (98)
- **peripheral vision** area a person can see to the left and right of central vision (68)
- **perpendicular parking** parking the vehicle at a right angle to the curb (120)
- **personal reference point** adapting the standard reference point to one's own vehicle (119)
- **point-of-no-return** point beyond which a driver can no longer stop safely without entering the intersection (132)
- **powerplant** vehicle's engine or motor that generates power (356)
- **power steering** system that uses a hydraulic pump and fluid to make steering easier (363)
- **predict** second step of the IPDE Process in which the driver anticipates possible conflicts (6)
- **premium** specified amount of money paid to an insurance company for insurance coverage over a specified period of time (342)
- **prescription medicine** drug that can be purchased legally only when ordered by a doctor (321)
- **preventive maintenance** routine care and attention to your vehicle (368)
- **principal driver** person who will drive a certain vehicle most often (345)
- **property-damage insurance** protects the driver who is at fault against claims for damages to another person's property, up to specified limits (342)
- **protected left turn** left turn made on a left-turn light, green arrow, or delayed green light while oncoming traffic is stopped (137)

- **protective equipment** items a motorcyclist wears to protect head, eyes, and body (156)
- **pull-out area** additional right lane on narrow mountain roadways for slower-moving vehicles (214)
- **push-pull steering** pushing the steering wheel up with one hand and pulling it down with the other (113)
- radial tire tire that has plies that run straight across under the tread and strengthening belts of steel or other materials that circle the tire (365)
- radiator part of cooling system that holds and cools the coolant (360)
- **reaction distance** distance your vehicle travels while you react (99)
- **reaction time** length of time you take to execute your action (98)
- recreational vehicle large vehicle such as a van, motor home, camper, travel trailer, pickup truck, or sport utility vehicle, used mainly for pleasure and travel (165)
- reference point a part of the outside or inside of the vehicle, as viewed from the driver's seat, that relates to some part of the roadway (119)
- regulatory sign sign that controls traffic (20) restraint device any part of a vehicle that holds an occupant in the seat during a collision (100)
- **ride the brake** resting your foot on the brake pedal while driving (184)
- **riding the clutch** resting your foot on the clutch pedal while driving (54)
- **right of way** privilege of having immediate use of a certain part of a roadway (21, 142)
- **right-turn-on-red** turning right when the red signal is on unless specifically prohibited to turn (137)
- **risk** in driving, possibility of having a conflict that results in a collision (4)
- **roadway marking** marking that gives you a warning or direction (31)
- **roadway users** people who use the HTS by walking, driving, or riding (4)
- **rocking a vehicle** repeating the sequence of driving forward a little and then back a little to move your vehicle out of deep snow, mud, or sand (254)
- rumble strips sections of rough pavement intended to alert drivers of approaching roadway construction, tollbooth plaza, or other traffic conditions (33)

- **runaway vehicle ramp** place on mountain roads for vehicles to safely get out of traffic when their brakes are not effective (214)
- safety chains backup link used in case a trailer hitch fails (388)
- **scanning** glancing continually and quickly with very brief eye fixations through your orderly visual search pattern (68)
- **school zone** portion of a street or highway near a school that is subject to special speed limits (24)
- **selector lever** device in an automatic transmission vehicle used to select gears (42)
- **selective seeing** identifying and selecting only those clues and events that restrict your line of sight or can change your intended path of travel (69)
- **separate the hazards** process of adjusting the speed of a vehicle to handle one hazard at a time when two or more hazards threaten a driver (78)
- **shared left-turn lane** lane on a busy street that helps drivers make safer mid-block left turns into business areas from a center lane (31, 115)
- **skid** when tires lose part or all of their grip on the road (256)
- **slow-moving vehicle** vehicle unable to travel at highway speed (209)
- **Smith System** organized method designed to help drivers develop good seeing habits by using five rules for safe driving (7, 64)
- **solar-powered vehicle** vehicle that captures light from the sun and transforms it into electrical power (350)
- **space cushion** open area around a vehicle consisting of adequate following distance between it and the vehicles ahead and behind, plus swerve paths to left and right (76)
- **speed smear** occurs when objects off to your sides become blurred and distorted as your speed increases (302)
- **stale green light** light that has been green for a long time (136)
- **standard reference point** point on the vehicle typical for most drivers (119)
- **stimulant** drug that speeds up the central nervous system (322)
- **switchback** turn in a road that bends sharply in the opposite direction (213)

- **tailgate** to follow another vehicle too closely (180)
- **target** stationary object that appears in the distance in the center of the path you intend to occupy (50)
- **target area** section of roadway where the target is located and the area to the left and right of the target (66)
- **target area range** space from your vehicle out to target area (66)
- thermostat part of cooling system that opens and shuts to control the flow of coolant to the radiator (360)
- **total stopping distance** distance your vehicle travels while you make a stop (98)
- **traction** friction or gripping power between the tires and the roadway surface (74, 94)
- **tractor-semitrailer** type of tractor-trailer that pulls one trailer; commonly called an "eighteen wheeler" (167)
- **tractor trailer** truck that has a powerful tractor that pulls a separate trailer (167)
- **traffic circle** intersection that forms when several roadways meet at a circle (130)
- **traffic signal** any signal used to control the movement of traffic (27)
- **transaxie** device in a front-wheel drive vehicle that carries power to the front wheels via two half-shafts (356)
- **transmission** mechanism in a vehicle that delivers power from the engine to the drive wheels (356)
- **tread** outer grooved surface of a tire that grips the road (94)
- **tunnel vision** being able to see in a narrow field of vision of 140° or less (300)
- **turnabout** maneuver for turning your vehicle around to go in the opposite direction (116)
- **12–15 second range** area you will be traveling in during the next 12 to 15 seconds, and where you need to identify changes in your path of travel (66–67)
- **uncontrolled intersection** intersection that has no signs or signals to regulate traffic (139)
- uncontrolled railroad crossing railroad crossing that does not have flashing red lights or crossing gates (140)

- underinsured motorist insurance covers costs that exceed what the other person's insurance company will pay as a result of a collision (344) understeer not turning the steering wheel enough
- uninsured motorist insurance covers costs up to a certain amount if you are struck by another vehicle whose driver has no insurance (344)

- **zero-tolerance law** law stating it is illegal for persons under the age of 21 to drive with any measurable amount of alcohol in the blood (324)
- **zone** one of six areas of space around a vehicle that is the width of a lane and extends as far as the driver can see (65)
- **Zone Control System** organized method for managing the space—or six zones—around your vehicle (7, 64)
